Schiff Summer Nature Programs 15th Year!

This year's Summer Nature Program continues to grow as we offer programs that seek to inspire, educate, and provide loads of nature-focused FUN for kids ages 4 to 13! Co-Directors and Dynamic Duo Jenny Chmura and Marissa Fuellhart, both teachers at William Annin Middle School in Basking Ridge, bring energy, extensive teaching experience, and a love of nature that is contagious. Children will enjoy nature-themed camps such as: Animal Antics, Frogs, Turtles and More, Living Treasures, and Soaring through Schiff. The children will experience adventure hikes, river

exploration, wineberry picking, and tie dye making in addition to searching for woodland creatures, constructing debris huts, engineering giant spider webs, observing butterflies, and more. In doing so, they will also learn ways to protect and preserve the delicate balance between our great variety of species and their habitats. Schiff Conducts Prescribed Burn to Enhance Habitat and Protect Neighbors

Since 2004, the Schiff Natural Lands Trust has collaborated with the New Jersey Forest Fire Service to conduct a series of prescribed burn events at a variety of locations within the Schiff Nature Preserve. This practice is a safe and cost-effective method of reducing fuels, vegetation, and leaf litter that could contribute to an uncontrolled wildfire in the future. By conducting controlled burns, we aim to lower the wildfire hazard on our property and thus reduce the hazards to our neighbors as well. The burn was planned to occur during the last two weeks of March. However, due to this relentless winter, the burn was postponed to the first two weeks of April. At the time of the printing of this article, it is still unclear if the burn will be conducted. On the chance that it can occur, it will be conducted and overseen by professional firefighters from the New Jersey Forest Fire Service and the Ralston Fire Company. This year's targeted areas are the Great Meadow, a small grassy area near the Dan Beard cabin, and the meadow near our North Conservation Pond. For safety reasons, at the time of the prescribed burn, parts of the Schiff Nature Preserve will be temporarily closed.



NEW – "School's Out" program for kids ages 6 to 12

The NEW School's Out program has been a VERY POPULAR, fun, and exciting new addition to our Calendar of Events. The program provides a reprieve for busy

parents and a fun and educational option for kids during school breaks. Each School's Out program has an ecological theme from which our environmental educators develop a three hour program of games, projects, hikes, books, songs, and crafts. 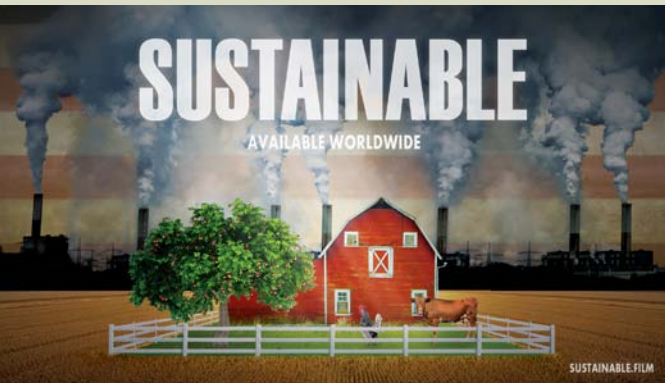


Q.Does Schiff Offer Birthday Parties for Children?

This past fall, Schiff Natural Lands Trust Board of Trustees welcomed our newest trustee, Alan Weinstein of Mendham. Businessman and entrepreneur, Alan enjoyed a long and successful career in the restaurant and catering business. He opened the Greenhouse Restaurant in Morristown in 1976 and then in 1982, purchased The Park Savoy. During his time at the Park Savoy, he partnered with the Morristown Community Soup Kitchen by donating specially prepared as well as unused food to the Soup Kitchen for 25 years. Alan was broadly recognized in 2013 for organizing a broader collaborative effort among 40 local restaurants, dubbed, “Kitchen to Kitchen” which ensured the continuation of the charitable services provided to the Soup Kitchen. Alan and his wife, Judy became Schiff neighbors in 1976. They have four children who all attended the local Mendham schools. He has served on the Planning Board for many years and has been an active hiker and horse rider throughout the Schiff property since the 1970’s. Since joining the Board, Alan has joined the Conservation and Stewardship committee and the Fundraising and Outreach committee where his professional experience as a successful business owner shall prove valuable.
