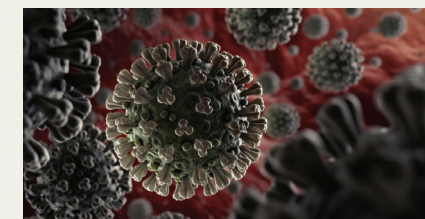
As for everyone, 2020 has been a challenging year for Schiff. It quickly became apparent in March that COVID-19 would require that Schiff revise its budget as we cancelled programs and events until we developed a clear understanding of the parameters under which we could operate. We had to make the difficult decision to cancel our popular Summer Nature Program for Kids and ultimately reschedule and downsize fundraising events.

In response to these challenges, our Board of Trustees initiated a \$20,000 Matching Campaign. Every dollar that was donated was matched by the Board up to our goal of \$20,000. We are so grateful to our community for their generosity and support of this effort in such difficult times.

Fortunately, our trails were the perfect place to hike, bike

or horseback ride and remain socially distanced. Our community was very grateful for this access, as we remained open while all state and federal parks were closed during the "stay at home" portion of the pandemic.

We have seen Membership in Schiff increase over the last six months, a silver lining in this uncertain time, as membership dollars are a significant annual source of support for our operations, which include land conservation and trail maintenance. Farm to Table Benefit Dinner Goes Grab and Go

Schiff's popular Farm to Table fundraising event inspired a number of memorable pop-up dinner parties around the area on October 10th as guests used the opportunity to share this special to-go meal with close family and friends in the comfort of their own homes. The delectable meals were created by the master chefs at Monterey Fine Foods in Bernardsville using locally sourced foods and beverages. This year's menu included a field greens salad garnished with a goat cheese crouton and maple syrup brittle (see recipe in box); dressed in a coriander, white pepper, and maple syrup reduction; a beef and sage sausage cassoulet with Long Island duck confit and veal reduction; gratin of root vegetables; and fall fruit pie for dessert. Schiff encourages you to eat local whenever possible and to support our valued partners year-round: Alstede Farms in Chester, Riverbend Farm in Far Hills, Wet Ticket Brewing in Rahway, and Monterey Fine Foods.

Historical Hike with W. Barry Thomson

On Sunday, September 20, local historian, author, lecturer, and Schiff trustee W. Barry Thomson led a group of 29 members and friends of Schiff on a two-hour historical hike covering three centuries of the rich and complex history of the Schiff Nature Preserve and the surrounding Mendham districts of Ralston and Pleasant Valley. With the use of archival photographs, rare maps, and other memorabilia, Thomson's talk began with the indigenous Lenape population and the early 18th century settlement of the area by Europeans and covered all the way to the conversion of the property to the National Training Center for the Boy Scouts in 1930. The hike included stops to take in the displays at the Schiff Nature Center and the stone manor house of the Brookrace estate. The group then walked deep into the preserve, making several stops along the way, including Dan Beard Cabin—originally built as part of a Boy Scout camp at the 1939 World's Fair in New York, the Scouts' woodland amphitheater, and Wood Badge Lodge. Stay tuned for another historical hike in 2021.

GOAT CHEESE CROSTINI & SCHIFF MAPLE SYRUP BRITTLE

Ingredients

For the Crostini

1 loaf French or Italian Loaf Bread
Olive Oil
Salt & Pepper to taste

For the Goat Cheese Spread

6 oz Goat Cheese
2 oz Cream
2 oz Fresh Thyme

Crostini

Slice bread 1/4 inch, brush with olive oil, sprinkle with salt & pepper and toast to desired crispness.

Goat Cheese Spread

Mix goat cheese, cream, and thyme with a whisk until smooth. Set aside.

Brittle

1. Spray a baking sheet with non-stick spray and line with parchment paper.
2. Stir together the sugar, corn syrup, and maple syrup and 1/2 cup water in a medium saucepan with a candy thermometer in the pan. Bring the mixture to a boil over medium heat, then continue to boil until the mixture

For the Brittle

2 Cups Sugar
1/4 Cup Corn Syrup
1/4 Cup Schiff Maple Syrup
1/2 Tsp Baking Soda
1/2 Stick Unsalted Butter
(1 1/2 Cups Nuts of Choice)

Procedure

is golden brown and reaches 340 degrees F, about 15 minutes.

3. Working quickly, remove the pan from heat and stir in the butter and baking soda until smooth. Stir in nuts if desired and distribute evenly.
4. Pour all onto the baking sheet and quickly smooth with a rubber spatula. Let harden uncovered at room temperature until cool. Break into desired pieces.

To Prepare

Spread goat cheese on crostini. Sprinkle the maple brittle on the crostini and serve with a salad.
